#### The Thorny Issue of Chanukkah & Christmas

Following the success of our first "Talking With Our Children about..." event, this community discussion, led by a guest facilitator, will be an opportunity for everyone involved with children as parents, grandparents, teachers, aunts, uncles and friends, to discuss the thorny questions of Chanukkah and Christmas.

This will run before the service on **Shabbat 6<sup>th</sup> Nov 10am – 11am** and Hebrew / cheder / crèche will run as normal during this session.

The light is changing. The days are growing shorter and the sun is sliding lower in the sky, bringing longer shadows, cooler air and a hint of colder times to come. Rosh Hashanah is approaching. How right it is that this time of introspection takes place at the turning of the seasons, towards the quieter times. When the nights draw in we move inside. This move inside can also happen within.

Jewish tradition has always seen a link between ethics and the weather. Drought was seen as a punishment for sin, and the remedy was a national fast, rituals of mourning and the blowing of the ram's horn. Rain was seen as a blessing, both gentle rain and hard, an answer to their prayers, a sign of divine mercy.

It seems very likely that we will once again read the story of our human ethics in the weather. Parts of our world have been facing terrible floods, and others have baked in unseasonal heat.

Should we do as our ancestors did: pray and

fast? Probably not, or not as a first step, since our climate needs a different kind of action. We need to be part of a global move towards taking responsibility.

Yet this ethical relationship to our world, our climate, reminds us always that we are part of a totality, profoundly interdependant with all other life. As fragile as the world around us, and also as strong, growing and capable of change. Shanah tovah.

### Women, Leadership and Religious Authority

If you were in shul in early June, you will know that I recently completed my MA in Religion and Society, which focussed on women, religion and spirituality. Rabbi Shulamit has suggested that we have a "siyyum" to mark the occasion. This traditional way of completing a period of study will take place at the Erev Shabbat Service on 22 October and will be followed by a festive meal, so please bring vegetarian food to share.

As indicated in the above title, I will be outlining aspects of my dissertation research and findings on women's contemporary religious leadership and spiritual authority. By taking a gendered view of religious authority, drawing in particular on the work of leading Jewish feminist theologian Judith Plaskow, I will address how it has impacted on women's religious and spiritual leadership. All of which I trust will lead to some interesting discussion!

My studies took a very long time - the full four years allowed to complete a part-time degree. Along the way I left my job and London in order to focus on studying,and went to live in Brighton with my brother Jonathan. It was thanks to his generosity and support that I was able to do nothing but research and write for a while. The result was my first paper to receive a high mark, and set the standard I was then able to maintain. So this siyyum evening is dedicated to his memory and will take place on the Shabbat following his first yahrzeit.
